Special guests of the Triennial Congress included the Right Honourable Prime Minister Stephen Harper, Minister of Employment and Social Development and Minister for Multiculturalism Jason Kenney, Leader of the Official Opposition Thomas Mulcair, and Leader of the Liberal Party of Canada Justin Trudeau. During the Congress, various issues important to our community were addressed, including integration of new immigrants into the community, Ukrainian language and culture, engagement of the next generation of Ukrainian Canadians, restoration of Ukraine's national memory, Ukrainian Jewish relations in Ukraine, and Canada-Ukraine relations.
