

SUSK supports peace in Ukraine

Since the beginning of Euromaidan protests in Ukraine, SUSK has urged Ukrainian Canadian students to advocate for the people of Ukraine and their struggle for a better, democratic future. SUSK now calls upon its member organizations and all Ukrainian Canadian students to take a stand and support peace in Ukraine, where Russian forces have contravened international law and disrespected Ukraine's sovereignty and territorial integrity.

SUSK denounces recent aggressive acts by President Vladimir Putin, but does not extend this opposition to the entire population of the Russian Federation. War is not in the interest of any nation nor any individual. This is evidenced in the icon to the right, which was created by Moscow-born designer Natasha Alimova using the shapes of the Ukrainian national symbol, the tryzub.
